**What are drugs?**  
 Definition: Substances that alter the normal function of the brain and nervous system, and have a potential for dependence. They are used for medical purposes, but some are used for recreational purposes. They can be legal or illegal, depending on the country and the specific substance.

**Addiction**  
 Definition: A chronic, relapsing brain disease characterized by compulsive drug seeking and use, despite harmful consequences. It is caused by changes in the brain's circuitry, particularly in the areas of the brain that control feelings of pleasure and reward.

**Dependence**  
 Definition: A state of physical and psychological dependence on a drug, characterized by withdrawal symptoms when the drug is discontinued. It is a result of the brain's adaptation to the presence of the drug.

**Withdrawals/UD**  
 Definition: A set of symptoms that occur when a person who has become dependent on a drug stops using it. The symptoms are caused by the brain's adaptation to the presence of the drug.

 - Depression  
 - Social withdrawal  
 - Changes in appearance and hygiene  
 - Financial problems  
 - Legal issues  
 - Health problems

**Dependence as a maladaptation**  
 Definition: A state of physical and psychological dependence on a drug, characterized by withdrawal symptoms when the drug is discontinued. It is a result of the brain's adaptation to the presence of the drug.

**Course of drug therapy**  
 1. Assessment of the patient's needs and goals  
 2. Selection of the appropriate medication and dosage  
 3. Monitoring of the patient's response and side effects  
 4. Adjustment of the treatment plan as needed
